The defendants are accused of tying up Gomez and his family in the living room of the home. Gomez struggled and was able to break free from his ties. Alejandro Romero is accused of struggling with Gomez and shooting the victim. Gladys Romero is accused of then shooting Gomez when he was on his knees. The defendants are accused of stealing a purse and fleeing the scene. Gladys Romero is accused of leaving her own purse at the scene. Gomez died at the scene. His family freed themselves and called the Santa Ana Police Department. The case remained unsolved and without a suspect for 10 years. On Sept. 30, 2010, DNA taken from Gladys Romero on a misdemeanor conviction was linked to DNA that was taken from her purse left at the murder crime scene. <p><b>PEACE, ROBERT VINCENT</b> In 2009, Peace is accused of meeting 13-year-old Jane Doe from Endicott, NY, in an Internet video-chat room on Stickam.com. He is accused of exchanging messages with the victim and instructing her to send him sexually explicit videos of herself masturbating over a two year period. In addition to the videos of Jane Doe, Peace is accused of being in possession of over 1,500 images and more than 300 videos of graphic, sexually explicit child pornography on his computer featuring young teenage girls. The videos include webcam footage. The defendant was arrested Jan. 20, 2012, in a traffic stop by HBPD, ICE HSI, and OCSD. Peace is accused of being in possession of additional images of child pornography in his home and vehicle, including images of Jane Doe. Peace is a citizen of the United Kingdom. When the defendants arrived back at the restaurant, 35-year-old Esteban Navarrete was leaving the restaurant and getting into his car with his wife and friend. He did not know the defendants. Maria Rocha is accused of being the driver and waiting in the car for her co-defendants. Sanchez and Ricardo Rocha are both accused of being documented criminal street gang members. The impact of the collision with the center divider disabled the engine and lights on Friedlander's vehicle before it came to a stop facing eastbound in the two carpool lanes. Friedlander was able to exit the car and run to the center median. The defendant is accused of causing a chain-reaction-crash approximately two minutes later with a motorcycle driven by 32-year-old JC Droege. The defendant is accused of killing Droege, who was pronounced dead at the scene due to multiple blunt traumatic injuries. Friedlander was taken to Hoag Hospital in Irvine and was treated for a fractured ankle, bruises, and cuts.					
<b>McANENY, REDMOND PETER</b> In 2008, McAneny is accused of representing widow Debbie S. in securing her late husband's life insurance proceeds. The victim and her husband had been going through a divorce and he had changed the terms of his trust before his death, leaving it unclear if his wife or son would receive his life insurance benefits. A settlement was reached to divide the insurance policy in half, and a check for over \$117,000 was issued to a trust fund account for Debbie S. on July 10, 2008. On July 15, 2008, after depositing the check into his client trust fund account, McAneny is accused of stealing the \$117,000 from Debbie S. and depleting the trust account by writing himself numerous checks with no reference to any case. <p><b>MONTES, ADSALON ISAI/ MAROQUIN, CHRISTIAN ROGELIO</b></p> <p>Montes is accused of driving in Orange with co-defendant Maroquin. Montes and Maroquin are accused of pulling over and approaching 19-year-old Noel Perez Aguilar and John Doe, and asking them where they were from. The victims gave their gang name. Montes and Maroquin are accused of getting out of the Camaro and assaulting Aguilar and John Doe. They are accused of severely beating Aguilar, who sustained skull fractures and slipped in and out of consciousness after the assault. The defendants are accused of beating John Doe, who suffered multiple lacerations to his head and face. Montes and Maroquin then fled the scene. John Doe called fellow gang members for help. <b>WILHELM, THOMAS MICHAEL</b> At approximately 6:25 p.m. on July 8, 2012, Wilhelm is accused of entering a neighbor's home on Redwood Avenue in Costa Mesa to retrieve a handgun without the neighbor's permission to enter his home or use the handgun. The defendant is accused of returning back to his own home to confront his live-in girlfriend of several years, 45-year-old Christine Murray. The defendant is accused of pulling out the firearm and shooting the victim several times until he ran out of ammunition. He is then accused of returning back to his neighbor's home, where he found a shotgun and fired one round into the ground. Costa Mesa Police Department (CMPD) officers, who investigated this case, arrived at the defendant's home minutes after the initial gunshot in response to third party 911 calls. CMPD officers found the victim with gunshot wounds to her chest. She was rushed to Western Medical Center, where she was pronounced dead. <p>Vason Development, a business that processed home loan applications. Lohia, a licensed real estate agent, is accused of working out of both offices. The four defendants are accused of using these offices to process fraudulent loans. Between April 2006 and March 2008, Lohia, Soni, Suniti Shah and Dinesh Shah are accused of conspiring to commit grand theft by recruiting straw buyers through friends and family, as well as their personal employees. Between June 2006 and October 2009, Lohia, Soni, Suniti Shah and Dinesh Shah are accused of obtaining 54 fraudulent loans on 29 real estate properties in Orange County through the use of straw buyers' credit. The four defendants are accused of fabricating loan applications to reflect significantly higher incomes for the straw buyers, supplying altered bank statements to reflect the higher incomes, falsifying employer information on loan documents, and forging the names and signatures of straw buyers on various deeds and loan documents. They are accused of using the personal and credit information of the straw buyers to complete the fraudulent documents used in obtaining loans. The four defendants are accused of taking out fraudulent loans under their own names. Lohia was sentenced April 20, 2012, to eight years in state prison.</p>

Meanwhile, Barrientos is accused of approaching a second female, 19-year-old Jane Doe, outside of a restroom on campus. Jane Doe and the defendant did not know each other. The victim takes special education classes at the school and is severely mentally and physically disabled. Jane Doe has a developmental level of a 5 to 6-year-old child, wears leg braces on both legs, and has impaired speech. The defendant is accused of putting his arm around the victim and leading her into a stall in the men’s restroom. He is accused of forcibly sexually assaulting Jane Doe as she cried including forcing the victim to orally copulate him and raping and digitally penetrating her. Barrientos is accused of then leaving Jane Doe in the bathroom, where she was found shortly thereafter by a teacher. The defendant was contacted on campus by security, who were searching for him after the initial complaint from the first female student.</p>					
<p><b>GIBSON, ALWYN</b> Gibson is accused of going to the Irvine home of his former girlfriend, who no longer lived in the home and was not present at the time. <p>The defendant is accused of entering the home carrying a firearm and placing a large citrus fruit over the barrel to muffle the sound of shots being fired. Gibson is accused of demanding money from the family and searching through Ly Le's purse. He is accused of shooting Ly Le one time in the arm and hitting David Le over the head with the firearm. Gibson is accused of forcing De Ngoc Le and Michael Le to kneel in an upstairs bedroom and shooting De Ngoc Le in the back of the head, murdering him. He is accused of shooting Michael Le in the back of the neck. Michael Le was in serious condition in the hospital for several days but is expected to survive. He is accused of keeping her body in their home over the next few days until he rented a recreational vehicle (RV). Forsberg was arrested, Aug. 30, 2010, at Desert Regional Medical Center in Palm Springs. The defendant had been admitted to the hospital and a citizen contacted the police after recognizing him from media coverage requesting public assistance locating the defendant and his wife.					
<b>CASAS, PATRICIA ROSARIO</b> The defendant was a Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) employee. On four occasions, Casas is accused of charging four customers for services at a DMV office and accepting cash payments from them. After the transaction, the defendant is accused of changing the previous cash fees in the computer system to show as a "no fee transaction" to make it look as if the services she provided were free. <b>BUSTAMANTE, CARLOS</b> Bustamante is accused of sexually assaulting at least seven women between 2003 and 2011 while working in his official capacity at Orange County Public Works, most recently as an administration manager. The defendant is accused of targeting women with similar ethnic backgrounds, age range, and physical characteristics. All seven of the charged victims were County employees and subordinate to the defendant at the time they were victimized. Bustamante is accused of targeting victims whom he knew to be vulnerable due to their emotional state, current relationship status, or employment position. To protect the identities of the victims and the integrity of the ongoing investigation, no additional specific information regarding the victims will be released at this time. In 2010, Bustamante is accused of wanting to attend a two and a half week Senior Executives in State and Local Government program at Harvard Kennedy School in Boston. The cost for the program was \$11,200 plus airfare and other expenses. <p><b>BRYAN, ASHLEY SELINA</b></p> <p>At approximately 11:55 p.m., Bryan is accused of driving under the influence of alcohol northbound on California State Route 57. The defendant is accused of failing to avoid a disabled Chevrolet Camaro, which was stopped on the right shoulder. The driver of the Camaro, Logan Vescio, 18, was seated in the passenger seat of his disabled vehicle. Victim Cameron Cook, 18, had been a passenger in the Camaro and was standing outside of the vehicle near a guardrail. The force of the crash caused by Bryan pushed the Camaro into Cook, who was knocked backward over the guardrail. The victim fell approximately 50 to 60 feet and landed on a concrete embankment below the freeway. Cook was transported to the hospital, where he was pronounced dead shortly after 5:00 a.m. Vescio suffered abrasions to his face. The defendant was transported to the hospital for minor cuts and bruises. Responding officers contacted the defendant at the hospital. The defendants are accused of violently attacking Padilla including punching, kicking, and using a slashing weapon to cut or stab the victims. The victims were seriously injured, but none died, as OCSD deputies quickly responded in

each case prior to the defendants completing their plans to murder the victims.					
<b>NICOLAS, JORENE</b> Nicolas is accused of speeding northbound on Interstate 405 near Edwards Street. She is accused of being distracted and inattentive while driving and failing to notice that the traffic ahead had come to a complete stop. After an 18-month investigation by the OCDA Bureau of Investigation, the Orange County Grand Jury heard evidence from 30 witnesses from February to March 2006. Becker, then the Director of Public Works, violated conflict of interest laws while acting in his official capacity as a Placentia City Officer. D’Amato, the Placentia City Administrator, is accused of helping Becker participate in making two contracts in which Becker had a financial interest. The first contract, executed on April 4, 2000, created the ONTRAC, a joint power authority. The second contract engaged Christopher Becker as Executive Director of ONTRAC while he was employed concurrently as Placentia’s Director of Public Works. ONTRAC was formed to facilitate a railroad lowering project in the City of Placentia. Originally budgeted at \$300 million, projected costs to complete the railroad lowering plan burgeoned to over \$500 million, before the lack of sufficient funding forced the abandonment of the project in 2005.
